TOPIC & SPEAKERS:

Bob Box from Nokia's Workplace Resources team and John Hughes from Steelcase's Workplace Strategies Consulting group will present a case study of how Nokia has developed their global Mobile Workplace initiative.

Steelcase and Nokia worked together to define and expand upon these objectives, working with Nokia business leaders to show how the workplace strategy aligns with Nokia's business strategy and how they developed a streamlined process for implementing the new solutions. The initiative is ongoing, and Nokia will share learnings about how the implementation process localizes solutions to meet the needs of different markets and business groups.

This implementation process employs a number of unique tools and techniques, including a number of the most appropriate aspects of Steelcase's Community Based Planning process, as well as other methodologies developed by Nokia and Steelcase. Preliminary findings from Nokia's Mobile Workplace Lab (an experimental workplace embracing mobile working) will be presented as well as the process for developing the analysis framework.

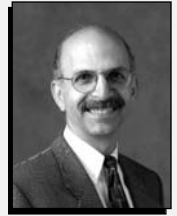

## BRANAN TOWERS

Branan Towers, our newest community partner, is one of seven retirement communities of Wesley Woods, Inc. Wesley Woods was founded in 1954 by leaders of the North Georgia Conference of the United Methodist Church and Emory University, and has served people of all races, creeds and income levels through residential retirement communities, long-term nursing facilities and a geriatric hospital.

Branan Towers, located in East Atlanta, has remained successful in providing housing and life enrichment programs to senior citizens 62 years of age and older. Although Branan Towers is a private, non-profit facility, all 176 one-bedroom apartments are subsidized by the Section 8 Housing Assistance Program (HUD). Built in 1973, the 30-year old facility faces challenges as it strives to remain competitive and attractive. Because operating funds only cover a 'roof over the head,' funding for any capital improvements or upgrades must be raised. Branan Towers has been fortunate to have received grants for the refurbishment of the First Floor common areas and replacement of major plant service equipment, as well as funding for the enhancement of the Wellness Program and the Activities Programming. However, the resident apartments and the common areas and hallways on the remaining ten floors require significant structural and cosmetic upgrades.

## MOLD CONCERNS

Rains are finally coming to our area. As Spring ends and the Summer storms begin, the lawns, yards, flowers get watered, and so do the mold spores who have been standing by, waiting for the moisture. With excess moisture in the air and high humidity daily, buildings, people and objects are trying to deal with all this water.

The hidden areas of structures, which have been drying out in the lack of rainfall are now starting to absorb moisture and create wonderful breeding grounds for mold. We all know the usual damp dark corners, crawl spaces, and unused storage areas are starting to smell of musty mildew odor. That odor is actually the digestive process of mold spores. It is a by product of their "eating" and growing. It should not be ignored. Addressed early on, the results will be well rewarded with significant cost savings.

Mold does not only grow inside, but outside also. However this tends not to effect us as much unless it is causing offensive odors. This is easily removed by regular maintenance methods, such as power washing surfaces of green slime before we paint them, or just for appearance of brick or stone surfaces. We have all seen many homeowners and building managers have their driveways and or walks power washed to remove the "black stuff". Some of that

black stuff is actually mold, but since it is outside we do not pay much attention to it.

How to deal with the excess humidity? In many homes and buildings the excess moisture is under control by the air conditioning systems. The larger the system the more we deal with condensation and excess water run off. (That is another article by itself) We have seen large systems get contaminated by fresh air intakes that were not properly built and became a victim of the excess moisture, by "inhaling" too much rain water during the raining season, prior to the air passing through the filter system. Again, just observing systems that are controlling moisture, from emptying the home dehumidifier, confirming dehumidifiers are working, and inspecting large roof top or commercial systems, will help head off problems before they happen.

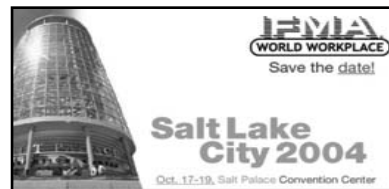
