Speaker Sean Kaufman, a behavioral specialist who has worked with CDC, the USPS during the anthrax exposures, and businesses at Los Angeles International Airport affected by SARS, had us exhibit the transmission process by touching two individuals apiece. We quickly spread our "bumps" just like a real pandemic would unfold, with small pockets holding out much longer than the initial impact from starting our disease.

With several important tips for preparing and also practicing for business continuity, Sean made a big impact on our audience. One key learning was that a plan by itself does not equal preparedness. Sean stressed the importance

> of communication and practice, as well as other behavioral impacts as simple as washing your hands more frequently and implementing alternative and remote scheduling so that workers know how to operate in this manner before a disaster.
