LONG, ALDRIDGE & NORMAN is conveniently located inside I-285 ("The Perimeter") downtown at 134 Peachtree Street, N.W. on 6-1/2 floors of the Historical Landmark Rhodes-Haverty Building. The main Fulton County Library is on the west side of the building with the red clay Georgia Pacific Skyscraper and the elegantly ornate Candler Building on the east side.

When approaching the office from I-75/I-85 SOUTHBOUND ("The Downtown Connector"), use the COURTLAND STREET Exit and go to the 5th traffic light and turn Right. This is HOUSTON STREET (not pronounced like Houston, Texas but "House ton") which dead ends into Peachtree Street and the Rhodes-Haverty Building.

When approaching the office NORTHBOUND on I-75/I-85, exit at EDGEWOOD AVENUE and turn Left. Go under the freeway 2 lights to PIEDMONT AVENUE and turn Right. Stay left and at the second light, turn Left onto HOUSTON STREET. The next street is Courtland and 2 more lights take you to Peachtree Street.

There are a variety of pay Parking Lots that charge from \$3.50 to \$10.00 a day on Houston Street and within one block of the building. The main reception area is on the 19th floor.
