The IFMA tour on October 17th acquainted the group with the meeting facilities for association as well as corporate use. Some of the Inforum features are:


- An executive meeting center with reception room, telephone, and audio visual equipment

Inforum accommodated 95 events over the past year with the trade shows averaging two to three days in length. Inforum is a facility capable of handling large groups of people, yet as Ted Kloss, N.B. Kloss Interiors pointed out, the combination of materials creates a pleasing yet professional environment.
