
President's Message

Mr. Jeff Floyd, AIA, a principal of the Sizemore Floyd firm, will be our January speaker. Jeff's experience certainly includes complex architural projects, but he also has proven abilities on projects that are not so easily defined. Jeff is Lead Planner for ACOG and we know his talk will be an informative one.

In July 1991, the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games (ACOG) selected Sizemore Floyd Ingram, a joint venture team of Sizemore Floyd Architects and Cordell W. Ingram, Inc., as its architectural facilities programming and planning firm. The scope of their work entailed master planning and programming for the 26 sports venues to be staged in Atlanta. This includes building eight new facilities plus renovation to existing structures to accommodate the needs of the other 18 venues. The estimated budget for facilities investments is close to \$500 million. Under the direction of ACOG's Vice-President for Construction, William Moss, SFI has established the overall planning criteria and identified all operating systems that impact the development and use of facilities for the olympic sports venues.





New Allied/Affiliate Wait List

New procedures for handling prospective Allied/Affiliates when membership is not currently available due to the required mix of professional and nonprofessional members, adopted by the Board at the December meeting. Starting January 1, 1993, all prospective Allied/Affiliate members must pay \$30 per calendar year to be included on the wait list. The wait list members are entitled to attend all meetings and functions sponsored by the chapter at the guest rate in addition to receiving the monthly newsletter. Allied/ Affiliates who choose not to be included on the wait list will be limited to attending no more than three meetings per calendar year.

A wait list membership is renewable at the beginning of each calendar year. Wait list request forms will be sent out in early January to all Allied/Affiliates currently on the wait list. In order to maintain their current position on the list, the Allied/Affiliate must renew their membership by February 15th of each year.

The wait list member at the top of the list will be eligible to join when a full Allied/Affiliate membership becomes available. Or, to expedite the process, wait list members can sponsor three professionals into the chapter and automatically advance to full membership.
