

#### **Project Management**

According to the Project Manager Institute a PROJECT is a temporary endeavor undertaken to create a unique product or service. It has a start and stopping point. It has a set of unrelated activities to achieve a single purpose. It consumes resources and it needs to be managed.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT is the art of directing and coordinating human and material resources throughout the life of a project by using modern management techniques to achieve predetermined objectives of scope, quality, time and cost, and participant satisfaction. Successful Project Management utilizes many skills. One must be technological, flexible, creative, know how to cope, be organizational, strong in communication, team building, and leadership.

A good Project Manager must simultaneously control performance and juggle time and cost. If one is out of balance, it impacts the other two. For instance, construction might be delayed because of back-ordered carpet. The furniture was ordered weeks ago and is on the way. You end up re-routing and storing furniture, delaying installation, and postponing the scheduled move-in. The dominos continue to fall and there goes your project budget, not to mention the overall impact on the company's productivity and profit margins. Remember. —a project is a problem scheduled for solution. But, be careful, if the problem is not defined correctly, you may find the right solution to the wrong problem! Backtracking and analyzing after project close is essential for future success.

The Project Manager is the added value of a project. By developing closer relationships with the customer (internal or otherwise), vendors, manufacturing and distribution, he develops time lines, establishes ownership, provides a dedicated processing support, displays a positive attitude and skilled experience, and most importantly the knowledge and ability to get thing done.

Project Management is an integral part of the facility function. If you need more experience in this area help is available from many different sources. IFMA, PMI, and BOMA all offer courses in Project Management. You have valuable resources right here within the Atlanta Chapter and possibly within your own organization. You could volunteer to be a part of a project team that your own company may be forming for an upcoming project. The opportunities are out there. Step out of your comfort zone. Go for it!
